## Chicago Fire Soccer Club Falls 2-1 to FC Cincinnati

The Chicago Fire Soccer Club (5-9-7, 22 points) fell 2-1 to FC Cincinnati (5-13-2, 17 points) at SeatGeek Stadium on Saturday night. The result marked the Fire's first loss at home since March 16, ending an eight-game home unbeaten streak. The Fire's goal was scored by midfielder Nicolás Gaitán during stoppage time in the first half.

FC Cincinnati scored in the first minute of the match when a deflected cross into the six-yard box fell to midfielder Allan Cruz, who was able to volley the ball into the back of the net.

In the 25th minute, the Fire had a strong chance to level the score when forward CJ Sapong was brought down just inside the 18-yard box, earning a penalty kick for the home side. Gaitán stepped up to the spot and sent goalkeeper Spencer Richey the wrong way, but his shot hit the post.

Gaitán's attempt was the final play before a 59 minute weather delay, halting the match in the 26th minute.

Six minutes after play had resumed, the Fire created another scoring chance when midfielder Aleksandar Katai cut the ball back inside on his left foot sending his marker sliding out of play. After picking his head up to find a teammate, Katai drove a cross into the box for Sapong, who directed his header just over the target.

Cincinnati attempted to respond in the 38th minute when Cruz slipped in behind the backline and clipped the ball past Fire goalkeeper Kenneth Kronholm. However,



defender Francisco Calvo read the play and raced back to the goal to calmly clear the ball away (WATCH). The play marked the second straight match that Calvo has produced a goal-saving clearance. To view his defensive play against Sporting Kansas City on July 6, click HERE.

The Men in Red eventually found the equalizer in the fourth minute of first half stoppage time after earning another penalty kick for a handball in the box. After having his initial attempt saved by Richey, Gaitán slotted home the rebound (WATCH). The Fire concluded the first half with a 10-4 advantage in total shots and by dominating possession (63%-37%).

After adding five more shots early in the second half, the Fire created another close chance to score in the 77th minute when Calvo connected with Gaitán's corner kick at the near post, flicking the ball on target, forcing Richey to make a sprawling save (WATCH).

FCC scored the game's deciding goal in the 83rd minute when forward Fanendo Adi's left-footed strike from 18 yards out was placed just inside the far post.

Looking ahead, the Fire will face a quick turnaround in league play. The Men in Red are scheduled to return to Seat-Geek Stadium on Wednesday, July 17 to take on Columbus Crew SC. Scheduled to begin at 7:00 p.m. CT, the match will be broadcast live on ESPN+ and transmitted locally in Spanish on Univision Radio WRTO AM 1200.






















## Portland Timbers 2, Colorado Rapids 2

The Portland Timbers and Colorado Rapids played to a 2-2 draw in a wild Week 19 match at Providence Park.


Timbers goalkeeper Steve Clark made four sprawling saves in the first half, but the Timbers went down a man in the second half and in the end, failed to hold two separate leads against the visiting Rapids.

The Timbers played the final 35-plus minutes with 10 men after defender Julio Cascante was sent off for a hard foul on

the Rapids' Kei Kamara with the score at 1-1. But a hand ball in the box committed by the Rapids' Lalas Abubakar in the 62nd minute led to Diego Valeri slotting home from the spot for a momentary 2-1 Timbers lead.

Sam Nicholson's 76th-minute goal kept the Rapids from leaving without a point. Colorado hasn't beaten the Timbers in more than two years.

The teams exchanged goals in the first half: A badly-timed header by Colorado's

THE BIG PICTURE: The Timbers will want to address numerous defensive breakdowns and they have to feel fortunate to get a draw, given that Colorado did much more to win. The Rapids arguably deserved better than a point and got a standout effort from Andre Shinyashiki on the wing, his speed proving a factor. Colorado gets three of the next four matches at home in an effort to climb the table, not including a friendly against Arsenal on Monday.

MOMENT OF THE MATCH: Abubakar's gaffe was exactly what the shorthanded Timbers needed, though they couldn't get three points. Valeri did what stars do and put away the kick from the spot.

MAN OF THE MATCH: Clark kept the match at 1-1 with a pair of saves on the same Rapids possession, and then another seconds later. The Timbers were fortunate to be tied at halftime. And he wasn't done -- Clark turned away a Nicolas Mezquida attempt in the 72nd minute when he came off his line for a huge stop and finished with six saves.

# Real Salt Lake 4, Philadelphia Union 0

The Week 19 matchup at Rio Tinto Stadium between Real Salt Lake and the Philadelphia Union turned into the Jefferson Savarino show, as the winger scored twice and assisted once to power the home side to a 4-0 win.

The Venezuelan first found net in the 23rd minute after latching onto an Aaron Herrera ball over the top. With a touch to control and a left-footed volley, Savarino made it 1-0 in slamming past Philadelphia goalkeeper Andre Blake.

Savarino then found his second goal in the 71st minute, capitalizing on some confusion from the Union in midfield. After a pass from Kyle Beckerman and touch forward, the 22-year-old rifled home to the far post.

Adding insult to injury, Savarino then set up an Albert Rusnak goal in the 81st minute after a poor turnover from Union outside back Raymon Gaddis. Savarino picked Gaddis' pocket and heel-flicked for Rusnak, who finished with conviction from atop the 18-yard box.

If that wasn't enough, Damir Kreilach added RSL's fourth and final strike in the 89th minute after being slipped through by Everton Luiz. The goal was originally called back for offside, though Video Review judged that it was a proper finish.



Philadelphia didn't register a single shot on target, but they thought debutant Andrew Wooten scored on his first touch in MLS. However, Video Review ruled in the 78th minute that the ball traveled past the end line and out of play prior to Wooten's volley, further souring the Union's trip.

BIG PICTURE: After a gut-wrenching loss at the San Jose Earthquakes last weekend, RSL secured a bounce-back win to push up the Western Conference standings. Meanwhile, the Union have dropped to 1W-2L-2D across their last five matches to see their grip atop the Eastern Conference standings loosen.

MOMENT OF THE MATCH: RSL managed four quality finishes, so it's hard to have a wrong answer here. Still, Savarino's 71st-minute rocket was one for the highlight reels. The shot was struck with enough ferocity to challenge almost any goalkeeper.

### Minnesota United FC 1, FC Dallas 0

Mason Toye came off the bench and continued his recent hot streak, scoring the winner in stoppage time, before Vito Mannone saved a last-second penalty, to give Minnesota United FC a 1-0 win over FC Dallas in Week 19 at Allianz Field.

After a first half in which both sides passed well but lacked the finishing touch in front of goal, they dug deeper after the break. But while Minnesota had a few very good looks, Dallas held the edge in the major statistical categories and tested Mannone with more regularity than his goalkeeping counterpart, Jesse Gonzalez.

But the Loons snatched three points very late, as Toye scored his fourth goal in his last four games from a rebound allowed by Gonzalez after a save on a Jan Gregus shot.

Another substitute, 18-year-old Bryan Reynolds, then drew a penalty for Dallas after Video Review, going down under contact from Mannone. But Mannone played the hero, blocking Reto Ziegler's attempt, to hold on for the win.

# LA Galaxy 1, San Jose Earthquakes 3

The LA Galaxy scored early in their California Clasico match against the San Jose Earthquakes, but the visiting Quakes had the final word, coming back and winning 3-1 at Dignity Health Sports Park.

The win, coming two weeks after the teams' first rivalry game of the season, a 3-0 win for San Jose at Stanford Sta-

dium, gave the Quakes a regular-season sweep in the California Clasico.

The Galaxy got on the board early, as Rolf Feltscher acrobatically poked in a corner kick less than two minutes in to give his team the lead. But from there, it was nearly all San Jose, as they racked up a staggering edge in shots, 22 to 2, until Vako scored the 1-1 equalizer with a low shot from distance that nestled inside the post right after the hour mark.

Vako also had a hand in the go-ahead goals. He set up second-half sub Danny Hoesen, who made it 2-1 just two minutes after entering the match. And with five minutes remaining, a shot by Vako was saved by the 'keeper and the ball fell to teammate Jackson Yueill who buried the late insurance goal to round out the scoring in a decisive victory.

# Vancouver Whitecaps FC 0, Sporting Kansas City 3

Gerso played a part in all three goals to help lift Sporting Kansas City to a 3-0 victory over the Vancouver Whitecaps in Week 19 at BC Place.

He opened the scoring in the 24th minute, advancing unmarked into the box, cutting inside of his defender and hitting a shot toward the net that deflected in off 'Caps defender Ali Adnan for the own goal.

Felipe Gutierrez then doubled SKC's lead in the 56th minute. Gerso intercepted a poor 'Caps clearance and fed the Chilean, who sent a low drive from outside the box that made its way through the legs of a defender and past the goalkeeper.

Gerso put the finishing touches on his influential performance in second-half stoppage time, slamming home a ball that teammate Krisztian Nemeth cut back to the top of the six-yard box. The goal was Gerso's first of the 2019 campaign.

The Whitecaps, who handed 19-yearold academy product Theo Bair his first MLS start at forward, threatened to get on the board on a few occasions, but SKC 'keeper Tim Melia came up big when called into question. The



woodwork also thwarted Vancouver on a free kick in the 76th minute.
