Chicago Fire Falls 2-1 to New England Revolution

The Chicago Fire Soccer Club (8-12-9, 33 points) fell 2-1 to the New England Revolution (10-9-8, 38 points) at Gillette Stadium on Saturday night. After leveling the score via a Francisco Calvo header in the first half, the Fire fell behind 2-1 after conceding a goal with four minutes remaining in the match.

Full Highlights

The Fire came close to taking the lead from a set piece in the third minute when midfielder Nicolás Gaitán created an enticing opportunity for midfielder Przemysław Frankowski. Running onto Gaitán's out-swinging corner kick, Frankowski hit a first-time shot that skipped just wide of the target.

Despite the pressure from the Fire early in the game, the Revolution managed to score against the run of play in the

17th minute when midfielder Wilfried Zahibo made a nearpost run and got on the end of a Brandon Bye cross.

Three minutes later, the Fire responded with another chance on target when defender Francisco Calvo received a pass from defender Jonathan Bornstein and fired left-footed shot from the edge of the 18-yard box, forcing a solid save from goalkeeper Matt Turner.



With New England attempting to extend its lead, goalkeeper Kenneth Kronholm made his first save of the game in the 27th minute when he anticipated a ball that was played in behind Fire defenders for forward Cristian Penilla and denied the striker from scoring.

As the half progressed, the Fire continued to inch closer to an equalizer. In the 40th minute, midfielder Micheal Azira, capitalizing on a turnover, laid the ball off on the edge of the 18-yard box for Gaitán, who blasted a left-footed shot toward the bottom corner, forcing Turner to make a diving save, pushing the ball wide.

Chicago would eventually find the equalizing goal just one minute later when Calvo scored his third goal for the Fire. After earning a free kick on the left side of the field, Gaitán curled a precise cross into the center of the 18-yard box to Calvo, who carefully whipped his header just inside the far post to bring the Fire level in the 41st minute.

The goal marked the Fire's 10th goal from a set piece in 2019. Additionally, with an assist on Calvo's goal, Gaitán notched his team-high 10th assist of the season, which is the most assists in a single season for a Fire player since 2010.

Five minutes into the second half, the Men in Red nearly took the lead when Gaitán cut the ball back onto his left foot and fired a shot toward the near post, causing Turner to make another difficult diving save.

With both teams pushing for the game-winning goal in the second half, the Revolution managed to score in the 86th minute when midfielder Gustavo Bou intercepted a pass in the final third, before scoring a left-footed strike from outside the 18-yard box.

Looking ahead, the Fire will travel to face Columbus Crew SC at MAPFRE Stadium on Saturday, Aug. 31. Scheduled to begin at 6:30 p.m. CT, the match will be broadcast live on ESPN+ and transmitted locally in Spanish on TUDN Radio Chicago 1200 AM.

Toronto FC 2, Montreal Impact 1

Toronto FC have finally made it back over the line.

Using goals from Marky Delgado and Justin Morrow, TFC came from behind to defeat the Montreal Impact 2-1 Saturday night at BMO Field. It marked the first time Toronto has jumped among the top seven Eastern teams since May 6.

Playing their first game under new head coach Wilmer Cabrera, the Impact broke the deadlock five minutes into the second half when former Barcelona forward Bojan Krkic ripped a 25-yard shot past a diving Quentin Westberg to open his MLS account.

Toronto did not back down, and the equalizer finally came. Second-half substitute Alejandro Pozuelo sent a dangerous ball into the box that Montreal goalkeeper Evan Bush punched away, but the ball fell to Delgado, whose shot from outside the box found its way through Bacary Sagna's legs and in.

The home side took the lead with less than 10 to play, when Michael Bradley, Jozy Altidore and Justin Morrow combined on a quick play, resulting in Morrow's shot going over the goal line after Bush nearly saved it.

FC Dallas 5, Houston Dynamo 1

The latest installment of the Texas Derby was all FC Dallas and El Capitan is staying put. Dallas got the better of instate rival Houston Dynamo 5-1, behind a brace from Zdenek Ondrasek and goals from Reto Ziegler, Jesus Ferreira and Michael Barrios.

In just his second start of the season, Ondrasek delivered. His brace were goals number two and three this season for the man nicknamed Cobra, a pair of one-touch finishes from six yards out in the second half to seal the result.

Dallas opened the scoring from the penalty spot in the 24th minute and didn't look back. After Jose Bizama pulled down Dom Badji in the box, Ziegler stepped up and smashed the spot kick into the back of the net.

A few minutes later, Ferreira's dazzling solo run culminated with a cool finish from the 18-year-old. Ferreira picked up the ball midfield, dribbled directly towards the Dynamo goal and slalomed through Houston defenders en route to his


seventh goal of the season.

Memo Rodriguez added a consolation goal in the 80th minute, before Barrios restored Dallas' four-goal lead deep into stoppage time.

New York City FC 2, New York Red Bulls 1

In a Hudson River Derby match rich with playoff implications as well as Heineken Rivalry Week intrigue, New York City FC rallied from an early deficit to avenge a July 14 loss in Harrison, New Jersey, edging the New York Red Bulls 2-1 on Saturday evening at Yankee Stadium.

Despite a flurry of first-half action, each team only found a goal each before halftime. Alex Muyl pushed the Red Bulls ahead in the 10th minute when an NYCFC turnover led to an excellent push through the final third, with Kaku providing the final ball to Muyl. Bradley Wright-Phillips almost got the Red Bulls a second with a chance for an easy tap-in just past midway through the half.

NYCFC, meanwhile, hit the crossbar (on a close-in Valentin Castellanos attempt), hit the post (on a Heber screamer from distance) and had an excellent Alexandru Mitrita free kick parried away by Luis Robles as they hunted an equalizer. But late in the first half, Maxi Moralez earned a penalty kick via a Michael Murillo foul. He took the kick from the spot himself and converted to get the hosts level.

In the 53rd minute, Heber struck in fine style to put the hosts in the lead for the first time. Anton Tinnerholm worked the ball toward the near post off a throwin, and the Brazilian backheeled a shot through Robles' legs for the finish.

The Red Bulls answered with three subs in 12 second-half minutes, including an MLS debut for Young Designated Player Josh Sims. Though Kaku and Tim Parker nearly engineered an equalizer just before stoppage time, the Cityzens held on for the win, even after losing Ronald Matarrita to a red card after a skirmish with Murillo.

Philadelphia Union 3, DC United 1

Kacper Przybylko pushed the Philadelphia Union ahead early on a devastating quick counterattack and assisted on two more goals before halftime in a crucial 3-1 victory over a struggling D.C. United side at Talen Energy Stadium on Saturday night.

Brenden Aaronson and Ilsinho each added a goal before the break for the Union, who stayed even on points with Atlanta United in the race for the top spot in the Eastern Conference. Atlanta, who currently hold the first tiebreak of total wins, visit Philadelphia next Saturday night.

In his first start in four matches, Luciano Acosta scored in the second half for D.C. for his first goal or assist since June 1, a stretch of nine fallow appearances.

With Wayne Rooney serving a red-card suspension, D.C. fell to their third consecutive defeat while missing the chance to climb back above the New York Red Bulls in the Eastern Conference standings. They've won only three of their last 17 MLS games.

THE BIG PICTURE: D.C.'s extended struggles are beginning to approach the territory of 2017 FC Dallas, who crashed agonizingly short of the postseason after winning only two of their last 15 matches. United are still five points above the playoff line at the moment, although



another loss at the Montreal Impact next weekend would see that gap narrow to 2 points. Rooney could be out for that one as well, according to the Washington Post's Steven Goff.

MOMENT OF THE MATCH: Ilsinho effectively put the game out of reach nine minutes before the break with the kind of slick finishing we've come to expect of the Brazilian. But the moment also personified just how poor D.C. were defensively during a half in which they were outshot 8-o.

MAN OF THE MATCH: Kacper Przybylko. The Polish-German striker notched a goal and two assists, and was a major problem for D.C. throughout the match. On this night anyway, the combination of his stature and technical prowess gave hints of another European MLS import who now plays in Southern California.

Real Salt Lake 2, Colorado Rapids 0

The Rocky Mountain Cup is again going to Real Salt Lake, as they secured a late 2-0 win over the Colorado Rapids on Saturday night at Rio Tinto Stadium as part of Heineken Rivalry Week.

The game flipped on its head in the 89th minute, when head referee Ted Unkel showed a straight red card to Rapids' striker Kei Kamara for a challenge on RSL right back Brooks Lennon.

That gave the home side a spark, and the eventual game-winner came in the 96th minute via Joao Plata. The Ecuador-

ian winger created a penalty kick, then deposited from the spot just underneath a sprawling Tim Howard.

Then in the 99th minute, RSL made it 2-0 via Jefferson Savarino. Sitting atop the six-yard box, the Venezuelan smashed home a cutback from Albert Rusnak.

The scoreline was a tad misleading for the night overall, as Colorado controlled large portions of the match. That was most evident in the 27th minute, as RSL goalkeeper Nick Rimando pulled off a stunning double-save that somehow kept the ball from crossing the line. Rimando



finished with five saves, while RSL didn't attempt a shot on target until the 65th minute.

In another twist on a wild evening, RSL thought their game-winner had arrived in the 91st minute via Damir Kreilach. However, Video Review judged that Savarino was offside before crossing to the back post, where the Croatian finished.

THE BIG PICTURE: Colorado dropped both games in the Rocky Mountain Cup this year by a combined 5-2 scoreline, and this loss makes it three games without a win for Conor Casey's bunch. They're surely heading home frustrated, because this one went from a hard-earned point to chaos in the blink of an eye. Meanwhile, RSL are now 5-1-2 in their last eight games and keep on making moves in the Western Conference playoff race. It wasn't pretty, but they don't all have to be.

MOMENT OF THE MATCH: The Kei Kamara red card was the ignition switch this game needed, but the highlight-reel moment was Nick Rimando's double-save. Even at 40 and in his final MLS season, Rimando keeps on pulling off the spectacular.

MAN OF THE MATCH. Joao Plata gets the nod here for the game-winner, which marked his first goal in a year. His last strike came on Aug. 25, 2018 against, you guessed it, Colorado. He's made headlines in 2019 for transfer rumors, but now makes one for his on-field performance.

San Jose Earthquakes 3, Vancouver Whitecaps 1

Chris Wondolowski added to his MLS record with his 155th career goal, one of three players to beat Maxime Crepeau on the night he broke Tony Meola's 22-year-old MLS record with 16 saves, and the San Jose Earthquakes defeated the Vancouver Whitecaps 3-1 on Saturday night at Avaya Stadium.

Judson and Andres Rios also scored for San Jose, who registered their own MLS records with 43 shots and 19 efforts

on target on a night when, quite literally, nearly all the action was in front of Crepeau's goal.

Wondolowski helped set up Judson's early leveler and Magnus Eriksson's picked up two assists as the Quakes snapped a three-match losing skid. San Jose moved into a tie on points with the LA Galaxy for fifth place in the Western Conference.

Jakob Nerwinski scored his first ever MLS goal early for the Whitecaps, who remain 10 points below the West playoff line at the bottom of the table with six matches to play.

THE BIG PICTURE: The 17,458 in attendance Saturday night saw several things no MLS crowd has seen in more than two decades. Meola's previous record of 15 saves, and the previous record for shots on target of 18, was set in D.C. United's 2-1 win over the New York MetroStars on April 5 of 1997. The MetroStars actually set the previous record for total shots in a match with 38 in a 2-1 loss to the Tampa Bay Mutiny in 1998.

MOMENT OF THE MATCH: Crepeau's record-breaking save was so imperceptable that announcers didn't believe it had happened in real time. Only after several re-examinations (not on this clip below) was it confirmed that his fingertips had in fact helped guide the ball onto the crossbar.

MAN OF THE MATCH: Maxime Crepeau. It's extraordinary times when a goalkeeper gives up three goals and is the man of the match. But as we've detailed, the 25-year-old Canadian international performed in clearly extraordinary circumstances.

FC Cincinnati 1, Columbus Crew SC 3

After a thrilling 2-2 draw in their first match a few weeks ago, there is no doubt which Ohio team reigned supreme in the second MLS installment of the Hell is Real Derby.

Columbus Crew SC beat FC Cincinnati 3-1 in front of a packed house at Nippert Stadium behind a Gyasi Zardes brace.

Zardes opened the scoring in the 22nd minute, a composed finish following a lovely early cross from Luis Diaz. The

sequence started with Zardes holding up a lofted pass from goalkeeper Eloy Room, that he laid off to Pedro Santos at midfield before making his run forward.

The American international got his second of the day 11 minutes later, this time on the end of an inch-perfect cross from Harrison Afful. The full-back's pass just over the Cincy defense bent straight to Zardes, who again delivered a composed finish when left one on one with Przemyslaw Tyton.

Diaz found the back of the net before halftime, as the Young Designated Player scored from a tight angle after a direct run behind. It was the Costa Rican's first goal with his new club, arriving this summer.



Kekuta Manneh scored a consolation

for Cincy in the 89th minute. With it being a derby, it's no surprise that the two sides combined for nine yellow cards.
