Chicago Fire Blanks FC Dallas 4-0, Moves Within Three Points of Playoff Position

The Chicago Fire Soccer Club (9-12-10, 37 points) scored four first-half goals to defeat FC Dallas (12-11-7, 43 points) 4-0 at SeatGeek Stadium on Saturday afternoon. CJ Sapong tallied his second brace of the season, while midfielder Przemysław Frankowski and forward Nemanja Nikolić each recorded a goal for the Fire. With the result, the Men in Red are now within three points of a playoff position.

The four goal performance in the first half marked the second-most goals the Fire has scored in a half this season. The

Fire previously scored five goals in the first half against Atlanta United FC on July 3.

The first goal came in the seventh minute when Sapong's hustle and determination caused a miscommunication between defender Matt Hedges and goalkeeper Jesse Gonzalez on a back pass to the goalkeeper. As a result, Sapong quickly pounced on the wayward back pass, touching it around Gonzalez before calmly converting his first goal of the game.

Less than 10 minutes later, Chicago doubled its lead when Frankowski scored for a second straight game, notching his third goal of the season. After receiving the ball from defender Jonathan Bornstein on the left wing, midfielder Brandt Bronico cut inside on his right foot and




whipped a cross through the 18-yard box to Frankowski, who scored a one-time finish from just inside the six-yard box in the 16th minute.

The team's third goal came in the 29th minute when Sapong secured his brace from a well-placed corner kick from midfielder Nicolás Gaitán. The corner kick from Gaitán was whipped to the near post for Sapong, who headed the ball through Gonzalez's legs. The header marked Sapong's 12th goal of the season – the second-most in a single season in his career – and his fourth headed goal of the 2019 campaign. Additionally, Gaitán recorded his 11th assist of the season on the play, which ranks as the most assists in a single season for a Fire player since 2008.

After attempts from Gaitán and Frankowski were pushed off the post by Gonzalez, the Fire eventually added a fourth goal in the 39th minute when Nikolić scored his third goal in his last four games. The goal occurred after Frankowski found the ball on the right side of the box and volleyed it to Nikolić, who took one touch to score from close range.

In the 63rd minute, the Fire came close to adding to their tally when Sapong and midfielder Dax McCarty both hit the post on back-to-back chances. The Fire looked dangerous off another corner kick from Gaitán when McCarty connected with the cross and headed it off the post. Following a clearance from Dallas, defender Johan Kappelhof smartly headed the ball back into the 18-yard box for Sapong, who also rattled the post with a headed attempt. On a defensive end, the Fire notched its eighth clean sheet of the season and sixth clean sheet at home. The team's six clean sheets at home are tied for the second-most in the league in 2019.

Looking ahead, the Fire's next match will take place against FC Cincinnati at Nippert Stadium on Saturday, Sept. 21. Scheduled to begin at 6:30 p.m. CT, the match will be broadcast live on ESPN+ and transmitted locally in Spanish on TUDN Radio Chicago 1200 AM.

























Minnesota United FC 3, Real Salt Lake 1

Powered by a Darwin Quintero brace, Minnesota United emerged with a 3-1 win Sunday evening over Real Salt Lake at Allianz Field. The victory vaulted the Loons up to third place in the Western Conference standings.

The battle of top-four sides in the West was settled by Quintero in the 51st minute, as the Colombian maestro rifled home at the near post to make it 2-1. Quintero collected at midfield, dribbled towards goal and nutmegged RSL center back Nedum Onuoha with his shot.

An insurance goal then came in the 83rd minute, as winger Ethan Finlay made it 3-1. The second-half substitute collected a through ball from right back Romain Metanire, then slotted past Nick Rimando with his left foot.

Finlay's strike capped off three unanswered goals for the Loons, who first tallied via Quintero in the 20th minute. He was played in behind by Kevin Molino, only to dribble Rimando and several RSL defenders before tucking home inside the post.

While Minnesota had the bulk of quality chances, the visitors found the opener in the 17th minute. A nearpost shot from Albert Rusnak snuck by Vito Mannone and made it 1-0. Minnesota's goalkeeper was rarely threatened thereafter.

New York City FC 2, San Jose Earthquakes 1

Keaton Parks scored his first MLS goal and Alexandru Mitrita added his ninth three minutes later to put first-place New York City FC in front en route to a 2-1 victory over the San Jose Earthquakes on Saturday afternoon at Yankee Stadium.

The two goals, coming inside the final six minutes of the first half, were enough to extend NYCFC's unbeaten run to seven matches and ensure they finish Week 28 atop the Eastern Conference standings.

For the moment, the Cityzens moved six points in front of the second-place Philadelphia Union, who play later Saturday at home against LAFC.

Chris Wondolowski scored his MLS record-extending 158th career goal and 14th of the season, but the Quakes fell to their second consecutive defeat and fifth in their last seven games.

San Jose began the weekend in fifth in the Western Conference, and depending on other results later could end it as low as eighth and one place beneath the playoff line.

THE BIG PICTURE: Wondolowski's 14 goals are his most in an MLS season since he scored 16 during the 2015 campaign. The 36-year-old could yet post 16 goals for a fifth time during his 15-year career. Meanwhile, NYCFC have now taken seven of nine points since losing their leading scorer, Heber, for what is expected to be a layoff of roughly a month total with a hamstring injury.

by Westberg.


However Toronto had the last say, as Jonathan Osorio — who had come in for the injured Nicolas Benezet — put away the winner.

A first-half own goal was the difference as D.C. United defeated the Portland Timbers, 1-0, at a rain-soaked Providence Park Sunday afternoon.

In the 25th minute, Ulises Segura, wearing the unfamiliar, nameless No. 32 jersey because blood stained his usual kit, sent a cross just inside the six-yard box. Bill Tuiloma slid in to intercept, but directed the ball into his own net.

D.C. had shouts for a second goal before halftime when Wayne Rooney's in-swinging corner kick went off Paul Arriola's back and then caromed off goalkeeper Steve Clark and rolled toward the goal. Eryk Williamson looked to clear the ball off the line, but replays appeared to show the ball was behind the line when the Timbers midfielder booted the ball away.

The Timbers, playing without Sebastian Blanco (left lower leg injury) and Brian Fernandez (stomach bug), twice hit the woodwork, with Diego Valeri heading the ball off the post in the 16th minute. Jorge Moreira's floated cross toward the back post in the second half caromed off the crossbar.

Arriola had a golden chance to put the game away in the 82nd minute, but his open shot went off Clark's hand and the post for a corner.

Fredy Montero scored a game-winning goal in second-half stoppage time, sending the Vancouver Whitecaps to a 2-1 victory over the Houston Dynamo at BC Place on Saturday in a matchup between the bottom two teams in the Western Conference.

Inbeom Hwang converted a second-half penalty kick to open the scoring for Vancouver, while Mauro Manotas scored Houston's only goal of the evening in the 78th minute.

After a scoreless first half, the Whitecaps found the opener in the 54th minute after Manotas was whistled for a hand-ball while defending a free kick in his own box, drawing a penalty kick whistle from referee Robert Sibiga. Hwang slotted home the ensuing look from the spot, giving the home side the 1-0 lead.

Whitecaps goalkeeper Zac MacMath deflected right in front of goal.



LA Galaxy 7, Sporting Kansas City 2

Zlatan Ibrahimovic scored his third career MLS hat trick, Sebastian Lletget also struck for a brace and the LA Galaxy made a statement while moving above the Western Conference playoff line with a 7-2 demolition of Sporting Kansas City on Sunday night at Dignity Health Sports Park.

In the process, Ibrahimovic set a new Galaxy club record by moving to 26 goals on the season, surpassing the 24 goals

Carlos Ruiz scored back in 2002. He's now within two of LAFC's Carlos Vela in pursuit of the 2019 MLS Golden Boot presented by Audi.

Joe Corona and Uriel Antuna added goals for the Galaxy, who moved up three spots into fifth in the West standings after beginning the night outside the seventeam West playoff field. It was the third time LA have scored seven goals in an MLS match, and the first since 1998, after an eight-match stretch in which they had only earned five points to slide down the conference standings.

Felipe Gutierrez scored both goals for Kansas City, coming on either side of seven unanswered by the hosts. Coach Peter Vermes' squad is now six points beneath

the playoff line with only four matches remaining.

THE BIG PICTURE: Sunday's result marks the seventh time in MLS history a team has posted seven or more goals in an MLS match, and the second time this season. The Galaxy are the only club to have done it multiple times, including when they set an MLS record for goals by one club in their 8-1 win over the Dallas Burn on June 4, 1998. By way of their 7-1 win over Montreal back in March, Sporting Kansas City become the first MLS club to score seven and concede seven in separate games in the same MLS season.

MOMENT OF THE MATCH: In retrospect, it's easy to forget SKC actually held a lead and were playing well through most of the first half when they caught some poor luck, with the ball striking Matt Besler's arm inside the penalty area. Despite Besler not knowing much about his handball, Ted Unkel had no choice but to point from the spot. Ibrahimovic would go on to score on a rebound after Tim Melia saved his spot kick.

MAN OF THE MATCH: Zlatan Ibrahimovic, with a strong honorable mention to winger Cristian Pavon. For all the turbulence Ibra can cause, the big Swede continues to come up at the biggest moments for the Galaxy. And boy was this match a big moment. It's his second hat trick of the season, after also scoring all the Galaxy's goals in a 3-2 win over LAFC on July 19.

Gyasi Zardes and Luis Diaz scored a goal apiece in the second half and Columbus Crew SC got an own goal five minutes from the final whistle, bagging a 3-1 road victory over Atlanta United at Mercedez-Benz Stadium on Saturday.

Josef Martinez scored the lone goal of the contest for Atlanta in the 19th minute, but Columbus struck for all three of its goals after second-half kickoff to take all three points.

The hosts opened the scoring in the first half after a laser cross from Pity Martinez in the direction of a charging Josef Martinez took a redirected deflection into the net, extending the star striker's MLS-record scoring streak to 14 consecutive matches and giving the Five Stripes a 1-0 lead they would take into the halftime break.

Diaz then found the go-ahead tally for the visitors on the hour mark, slotting home a class finish from just inside the

area past Guzan to the far post, giving Crew SC the 2-1 second-half lead and shocking the home crowd.

Crew SC got its final tally of the evening in the 85th minute after a botched clearance attempt from Atlanta center back Miles Robinson snuck past Guzan and into the goal, sealing the 3-1 final.
